New Paa-Ko Water Line Underway

Entranosa Water & Wastewater is starting work on a new 16-inch water line and larger booster pumps to increase flows to the Paa-Ko subdivision and golf course. The golf course has its own water rights and well. Entranosa has an agreement to transport water from that well to the golf course, so no residential water is used to irrigate the golf course. The new line is being funded by Mountain Ranch, Ltd., the developer of the Paa-Ko subdivision and will greatly improve water delivery to the Paa-Ko subdivision and golf course. Construction on the new approximately three-mile line should start in September and be completed by the end of the year.

Don't Waste A Drop



The office of the New Mexico State Engineer has released a handy, 24-page brochure in a PDF format to help homeowners through the joys of home maintenance. Sections are devoted to detecting

leaks, including easy faucet leaks and challenging ones like those under a dishwasher. The Engineers office estimates that a faucet dripping 60 drops a minute will waste 174 gallons a month; double that number of drops wastes 347 gallons a month. Clearly, leaks can cost a homeowner dearly on water bills. The brochure also tells homeowners how to use ordinary food coloring to determine if a toilet is leaking by putting a few drops in the tank; if color appears in the bowl, there's a leak. The brochure provides stepby-step instructions for addressing leaks in toilets of any design, faucets, showerheads and washing machines. These DIY repairs won't take the place of a licensed professional plumber, but can save homeowners money on smaller fixes. It's posted on the Entranosa website at www.entranosawater.com. It's clear, easy to follow and worth a read.
