Heroes to Entranosa's Rescue One of the challenges of operating a water system is the availability of contractors and parts for repairs. Recently, one of Entranosa's main wells was hit by lightning, which destroyed the

pump motor. All the well contractors that Entranosa regularly uses were either busy or were out for other repairs. In addition, the pump motor replacement was several weeks out even as tank levels were dropping due to the loss of production and the high demand. The King family of Stanley, NM offered their well contractor Dean Solomon, who works full-time for the family and is truly a one-man operation.

This involved pulling and replacing the motor but what about the new motor? A new well





company in the East Mountains, Usrey Well and Pump Company, did not have the large crane to pull the pump but had a supplier in Phoenix that had a replacement motor in stock. On July 3, Brenden Usrey jumped in his truck and drove all day to Phoenix to pick up the motor before the supplier closed for the Fourth of July. The next day, he drove back to deliver the motor. In three days and with a lot of effort from many people, the well was up and

Wastewater No More

For more than five years, Entranosa has been eliminating contracts with small non-Entranosa water and sewer systems in order to focus on the Entranosa system and its primary core business of providing

water to the members. Last September the membership approved to remove the requirement of participation in the septic program. This was followed by a vote by the Board to terminate the program and close out the accounts. This year Entranosa terminated its last wastewater service contract and is finally out of the wastewater business. At last month's Board of Director's meeting, the Board voted to remove "wastewater" from the Entranosa name which must be voted on by the membership this September. If approved, the new name will be Entranosa Water Association.

Membership Robo Calls

In July, Entranosa sent out to the entire membership robo telephone calls to conserve water to help keep the tanks full. The first call on the July 2 was in preparation of the Fourth of July for

fire protection. The second call on July 18, was due to a CNMEC power outage at our Central Valley wells. Twenty percent of the well production in the Central Valley do not have generators and with the high demand due to the heat wave, Entranosa usually loses 20 percent of the water in the tanks. Entranosa has 18 tanks with 3.5 million gallons of storage, which controls the booster stations that control the wells. Keeping the tanks full is critical for both supply and fire protection. Over the past several years, Entranosa has added more generators to the wells and booster stations and will continue to add more until power outages will have no impact on the production of water.
