Thank You for Helping Us Conserve Water!

Thank everyone for pitching in during the Independence Day weekend to conserve water and refill the Entranosa tanks. On Thursday, July 2nd, a robo call went out to 3,500 members asking them to conserve water in preparation for July 4th fireworks. Severe drought, in combination with a heat wave, had dropped tank levels to dangerous levels. Entranosa appreciates that all members heeded the call to conserve. As of noon on July 4th, all tanks were full and ready for any potential fires. During a low humidity heat wave, swamp coolers can use as much as 20 gallons per hour. High water usage coupled with dry months in May and June has kept Entranosa wells and booster stations pumping continuously for over 60 days. June was a record pumping and sales month, but also a month with the highest power cost. Entranosa has had a high demand on new member line extensions due to private wells drying up. June set another record with the highest volume of bulk sales to contract water haulers, and contractors.

Entranosa Mulls Expanding Water Storage In Light of Low Tank Levels

At the July 23rd Board meeting, in consideration of recent events, the Board is considering building a new

500,000-gallon tank at the Section 6 Crestview location. The Section 6 tanks are the heart of Entranosa's storage system and need to be expanded to a total of 1.25 million gallons. The Board referred the decision to the Finance Committee.
