Working to Settle Septic Accounts

The Entranosa Board of Directors and staff are working through over 2,400 septic program accounts to be settled. Before the end of the year, approximately 1,200

members will receive letters with their account status. Members will be required to select the options provided based on where they are in the pumping cycle, account balance and whether or not the member has complied with the program requirements. Members will have 60 days to select their option and return the form provided to the Entranosa office. Members in good standing will have the options to either get their septic tank pumped one last time, receive credit on their water bill or receive reimbursement for charges relating to



pumping service. The second round of 1,200 letters to members should be sent in February 2023. Members who are scheduled to be pumped this year and are having septic problems should contact American

Pumping to get pumped.

Keeping Your Faucet Flowing When

temperatures drop significantly the Entranosa staff is called to respond 24/7 to reports of "no water," which usually means frozen pipes. There is a new technology out that replaces the hose bibb covers to allow water to drip should the temperature drop below 37 degrees. It works by releasing the minimum amount of water to prevent freezing. For less than \$25, Entranosa members can avoid a plumbing nightmare this holiday.

Safety for El Cielo Azul Residents After more than a year, the fire concerns of the homeowners of El

Cielo Azul subdivision, were finally heard. Recently, the second of three out-ofservice fire hydrants was replaced. Entranosa has struggled to find parts for these substandard hydrants, along with the challenges of installing the replacements. The original developer never installed shutoff valves, which has required that the entire subdivision's water to be turned off during construction and repairs. The third and final hydrant will be replaced early next year. Entranosa has over 800 fire hydrants on our water system. These hydrants require constant repairs, especially during fall and winter when the water that remains in the hydrants freezes and causes damage.



Call Before You Dig

The contractor on this project did not callNM811 before starting the project. The result? Repair costs of

more than \$3,000 to this broken water line. Regardless of the situation, the member is responsible for any damages, so please make sure that either the contractor or property owner calls NM811 before any digging begins.
