Tips to Prevent Freezing

- Disconnect hoses from faucets
- **Protect outside faucets** with insulated covers
- Open kitchen and bath cabinets to keep warm air circulating
- Keep water moving by allowing a trickle to drip from an indoor faucet
- Keep the thermostat at a minimum of 55 degrees
- Keep garage doors closed to protect water heater and pipes
- Wrap exposed pipes in heat tape

weather inside and outside your home. A good place to start is by draining and covering outdoor fountains and draining hoses and swamp cooler tubing. Inexpensive foam faucet covers help protect outdoor faucets. Wrap exposed pipes in garages and crawl spaces to insulate from freezing.
