Septic Program Closeout Over 1,000 letters have been sent out to members regarding their septic program. Of those, only 10 percent have been returned with an average water bill credit or reimbursement of \$70. When members receive their letter, they have only 60

days to sign and return it — failure to do so will result in forfeit of any reimbursement.

Follow On Hose Bibb

At this time of year when temperatures drop to single

digits, Entranosa receives calls from members about

frozen water pipes. A very small amount of moving water will often prevent freezing. We found the Freeze Miser bibb drippers work really well, don't use too much water and you don't need to let your faucets drip to keep water from freezing. The only downside is the ice build up below the bibb. They are inexpensive and available to order on Amazon.

Water Heater Making Popping Noise

Does your water heater sound like it's popping

when heated? The sound is calcium pops in the bottom of the tank. The hard heated water will create calcium chunks and heavy calcium sludge in the bottom, which will reduce the life of your tank. We recommend members flush out their tanks twice a year, but especially if you hear pops. It is an easy task for most homeowners or contact a plumber. We also recommend replacing your sacrificial anode every two years.

Plans for 2023 Improvements

One of the big capital outlay projects for 2023 involves

the New Mexico Department of Transportation's plans to reconstruct the intersection of NM 14 and Frost Road. The NMDOT plans to construct a new round about. Because many Entranosa members drive through this intersection frequently, it is of great interest all our members. To accommodate this new round about, Entranosa will be required to relocate approximately 1,100 feet of new mainline, two commercial services and a fire hydrant. Because the state doesn't charge a right-ofway fee, Entranosa is being required by the state to relocate our utility without any reimbursement. As a member-owned, non-profit, Entranosa must use limited funds to accommodate the state, which will reduce the capital outlay budget for critically needed improvements to the system. Entranosa is requesting a waiver of NMDOT policy and/ or \$263,000 in

NM Capital Outlay appropriation to offset the cost of this project.
