# **Improving Water Flows & Pressures**



Work on improving flows and pressures on the south side of Interstate 40 is getting closer to completion. Crews have installed a 10-inch line on the north side to prepare for routing it through the HDPE black welded 16-inch line that will be pulled through an existing

24"casing under Interstate 40. The goal is to complete the entire project by the end of the year. This improvement to the south side of Entranosa's distribution system has been on the drawing board for the past 10 years and took a year of negotiations to build on private property.

## **Pumping Contractor Selected**

Through an extensive request for proposal process, followed with reference checks and interviews, the Entranosa Finance Committee and Board of Directors selected American Pumping of Albuquerque to provide septic services for our membership. American will be required to pump over 450 septic tanks per year, which is paid by members through

monthly charges to the water bill. This policy was added to the membership By-Laws as a ground-

swimming pools. The structure in the center is the discharge cage to the booster pumps, which ensures nothing large gets to the screens. From this point, the water is treated and distributed to the system.

## **Big Savings**

The Entranosa Water & Wastewater Association system

covers an area of over 260 square miles. System operators drive an average of over 35,000 miles per year. Reliable service trucks are the most critical piece of equipment in the operation. Recently, Entranosa purchased two new Chevy Silverado trucks from Tillery Chevrolet in Moriarty. Tillery participates in the Cooperative

Educational Services program which qualifies Entranosa as a non-profit organization. Purchasing through the program saved Entranosa over \$7,000 per vehicle.
