Entranosa Water Safe from Hacking

With the recent news of a water

system in Florida being hacked and the chemicals injection rate was increased to detrimental levels. We wanted to assure our members that they can be confident that this cannot happen on the Entranosa system. The Entranosa water disinfection process is monitored remotely but all controls of chemical injection have to be done locally at the booster stations / treatment plant. Booster stations are fenced, locked, monitored 24/7 by door alarms. The Mission-Managed SCADA system is Internet cloud based. However, the SCADA system only controls the wells, pumps and tank levels. Therefore, in case of a hack, it would only result in a loss of water for a short duration as operations is monitored 24/7 by Entranosa and computer control can be turned off and system operated manually.

With the new East Pine Canyon well coming on-line and increasing head pressure in the transmission line, Entranosa will need to increase pump size in some of its Pine Canyon wells.
