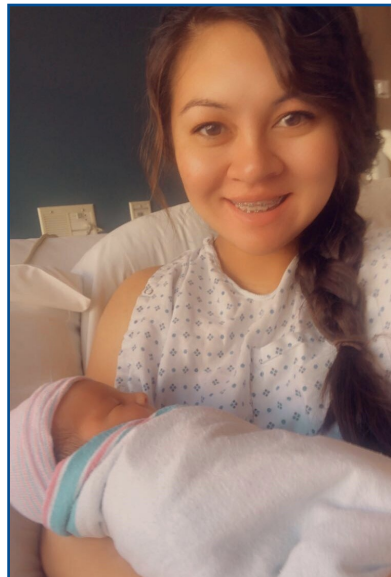

## Help Stop Water Theft at Fire Hydrants

Entranosa has over 800 fire hydrants in the system. Bulk water haulers, such as East Mountain Hauling, contract with Entranosa to pull water from hydrants based on customer location and water flow. Currently, Entranosa has only approved three locations for hydrant access: Hwy 333, next to Route 66 Travel Center; Mountain Valley Road north of Frost Road; and North Highway 14, in front of the closed Los Cuates Restaurant. Chuck from East Mountain Water Hauling is demonstrating the hydrant connection process. What is important is the attached Entranosa meter, certifying that a hauler is legal. 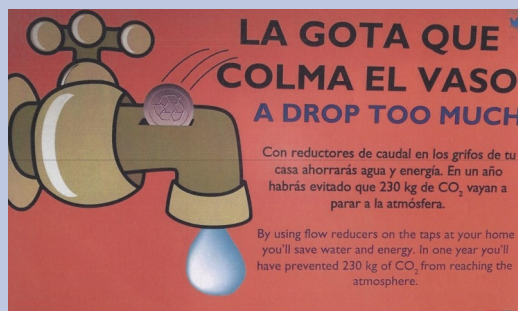
## Celebrate Water Conservation & Entranosa Water
