Southside Finally Connected!

After three years of dealing with private easements, rock and boring under two highways, the southside connection is finally being made. This will double the current capacity and will improve flows to the Steeplechase tanks, which support Steeplechase Drive, Five Hills, Longview Drive and Nature Pointe.



Update on Servline Protection

Reminder, yard line leak protection only covers

your yard line from the meter to your home. If you have connected to your yard line with a hydrant or added a second line to another building, any leaks at the connection point or

secondary lines are NOT covered with leak protection.



Monitor Spring Water Pressures

A new shipment of pressure gauges just

arrived in time for pumping season. As the weather warms up, more demand is put on the system, which increases pumping and

pressures. Please start monitoring your pressure now and remember any pressure over 80 psi needs to be reported to the Entranosa office. If you mention that you saw this announcement in the newsletter and need a



pressure gauge, you can purchase one for 5.00 - a 50-percent savings.

After millions of dollars and over two years of upgrades to

the system, System Manager Drew Padilla and System Operator Steve King reached the association's goal of producing 1,200 gallons per minute (gpm) at the Frost Road midline booster station. The



transmission lines along Frost Road are the backbone of the Entranosa system which needed increased flow to meet demand. The new upgrades have increased the flow over 300 gpm.

cooler months, Entranosa increased the pumping capacity at Nugent booster station. The new pumps have also increased the heat generated during summer months. This required Entranosa to install a new high-efficiency heat pump to replace the old, less efficient swamp cooler.
