The never-ending problem project continues at the N14

roundabout. After spending \$250K on relocation of the mainline to accommodate NMDOT's roundabout, a change in

the stormwater design required Entranosa to lower a 120-foot section of new mainline. The Entranosa crew lowered the mainline by three feet by splicing in a section of HPDE welded pipe. Hopefully, this will be the last time Entranosa will have to incur the costs on this



nightmare project.


Testing Hydrants

Bernalillo County will be testing fire hydrants in November for ISO ratings. Testing fire hydrants requires flow tests which could

result in cloudy water. If members experience cloudy water, flush your lines till the water clears. You may also need to change your water softener pre-filter.

Testing hydrants is important for insurance purposes as well. Insurance companies consider a variety of different factors when calculating

home insurance premiums, including the ISO fire rating in your community. ISO ratings reflect an area's preparedness to prevent and extinguish fires, such as the number of firefighters and water supply. While you can't always find your community's ISO rating, it can be helpful to understand how these ratings may
