

'Fishing' for Pump

Preparing for the 2026 pumping season starts early with the repair of well

S9. After only eight months in service, the new \$11K pump failed due to high heat and corrosion. When Roger's well company came to pull the well, the pump completely separated, plunging both pump and

motor 725 feet down to the bottom of the well. Roger's technicians fabricated a "snagging device" and lowered it three times before they were able to catch the broken pump and motor.





High-Tech Well Inspection

In October, Entranosa Water Association hired Jet West Geophysical Services of Farmington, NM to inspect the S9 well. The company uses new wireless technology that produces a high-

quality video, which technicians use to inspect casing. The S9 casing is fine, but the pump must be replaced.
