# 42<sup>nd</sup> Member Meeting- Big Success Under blue autumn skies,



approximately 200 of Entranosa Water Association's members gathered to learn about the financial health of the organization—and to have a terrific buffet lunch. Board Chair Rob Baracker thanked members for attending and introduced guests and the Board, including Treasurer Dennis Hodges, who told the crowd "this is a stable business. We are a member-owned

cooperative." Members also voted for two members of the Board of Directors and re-elected incumbents businessman Rik Thompson (143 votes) and retired civil engineer Joelle Hertel (134). Candidate Steve King ran a close third (117). Chairman Baracker invited CEO Jack Crider to detail some challenges Entranosa faces, including 40 years of wear on the system causing leaks; staff turnover; inflation causing higher operating costs; and replacing dead

meters and silt cleaning reservoirs. However, this year's monsoon season ended severe drought in Central New Mexico, which reduced pumping. # **Upsizing Generator Capacity**

upsizing its main generators so all booster stations and wells can fully operate during power outages. Nugent booster station is the largest in the system and is required to operate four large pumps. During power outages, the current generator will only operate one pump, which causes the entire system to become unbalanced. The new generator is substantially larger than



the original one, which allows Entranosa to "hopscotch" equipment within the system. The original generator will be moved to East Pine Canyon Well and that generator will be moved to S-9 well.



# Three-Year Survey

Every three years the State of New Mexico **Environment** Department Water Protection Division completes a Sanitary Survey. Over a two day period a compliance officer inspects all facilities and



records. The Inspector found six deficiencies; three non-operational tank level targets (Entranosa monitors tank levels electronically with sensors inside the tank that provides real-time data); two tanks with small trees too close to the tank and a well that appeared to not have a raw water sampling port, which was wrongly reported. A corrected action plan was written and submitted. The only items remaining are the tank level targets, which will be repaired in October when divers return to finish cleaning tanks and install new target cables. **The full report is posted to the website.**
