Annual Meeting and Election of Board Candidates





Changes to Yard Line Protection Coverage Entranosa Water recently sent out a notice to the members with the yard line insurance. Due to high claims on the yard line, the two policies had to

be separated. This will have no impact on members with leak coverage and they do not have to do anything other than change the phone number for claims to the new number of 505-407-8081. Members who want yard line coverage will need to wait for 30 to 45 days, while we work through the start-up of the new policy. The new policy will require members to go directly to the insurance carrier and purchase the policy for \$5.25/month. New Meters Arrived

Entranosa is finally receiving the meters we ordered last year to replace

old meters that had processed over 2 million gallons. In order to keep up with aging meters, Entranosa needs to purchase 300 new meters



per year. Members with old meters might notice an increase in usage as mechanical meters slow down over-time and can have up to 20 percent of loss revenue for Entranosa, New meters are ultrasonic without moving parts and should last for 20 years without loss of accuracy.
